Swindon's ready to bounce back

The coronavirus pandemic has had a major impact on businesses and local economies across the world but, here in Swindon, local firms are beginning to bounce back in typically resilient fashion.

In September, Swindon Borough Council launched the 'Swindon's Bouncing Back' campaign to highlight a number of projects which will lay the foundations for Swindon's economic recovery.

The local authority is working closely with the town's innovative business sector and support partners to encourage economic recovery and growth, playing a key role in helping to support and shape the local economy.

Some of this work, such as processing more than £30m in lifeline funding for businesses and implementing a fast-track licence process for businesses to be able to serve customers outdoors, has helped businesses to get back on their feet following the challenges of COVID-19.

Enhanced wellbeing advice and support has also been made available, while the Council has worked closely with partners, landlords and businesses to help shops, eateries and other venues to reopen safely.

As a local authority, the Council is using its powers, influence and assets to drive forward growth in the town.

This includes helping to fund a £17.5m upgrade of M4 Junction 15 to tackle congestion, paving the way for Zurich's new office to be built in the town centre, and supporting the construction of state-of-the-art broadband infrastructure in the town.

There are ambitious plans for Swindon's Heritage Action Zone which will revitalise our unique heritage, as well as an up and coming tech community being formed through the TechSwindon initiative.

This work and more shows that Swindon is ready to bounce back.

-Start and end every car journey in the village gently.

-Respect the speed limit and notice each other whilst driving around the village.

-Keep a check on our own speed, as it will encourage those passing through to help recognise the speed limit.

-Remind visiting contractors and delivery drivers of the 20mph speed limit through the village, by adding a simple note when ordering.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Coronavirus and Support in the Parish

There is some good news for those of you who have to self-isolate called the **Covid 19 – Test and Trace Support Payment Scheme**. This is a support scheme for those on low incomes who are unable to work because they have either:

- Tested positive for coronavirus, or
- Have been instructed to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace

There is a one-off lump sum of £500 that you can claim but check the www.Swindon.gov.uk website to check whether you qualify.

There are a series of help messages that you will see on our Facebook page and elsewhere. However, there are still those that are hard to reach and support in the Parish. Can I please ask everyone to keep a watchful eye out for those that might not read this or Broadcast Blunston or the Parish Facebook pages – or might not get to the Shop. If you think there is someone who might need help please ring Tracey on 705617 and let us know. Thank you.

Methodist Church and Hall

We are currently working with the North Swindon Scouts towards a possible solution where we may be able to keep the Methodist Hall as a Community Asset and will keep you updated as things progress. In the next magazine we will publish a 4 week consultation on whether you the Community want us to bid to take over the buildings to keep them in Community use. Inevitably this will involve a cost to each Parishioner and we will give you details of that to consider in your decision-making. Thank you to those who have contacted us with offers of help with the project and Tracey, our Parish Clerk, will keep in touch.

Remembrance Service

This years' service will be organised by the Church and will as I understand be by invitation only to ensure Covid Guidelines are followed. Representatives only from Village Groups will attend. See 'News from the Pews' for more details.

Recent Car Thefts

Please note that there has been a spate of car thefts from the Village and St Andrew's Ridge using scanners that pick up signals from keyless remote controls. The way to protect against this is to secure your car access device with a 'faraday cage' box or bag.

Car Parking

You may become aware of 'Polite Notices' on cars that are parked inconsiderately or on grass verges around the Village. Parking Enforcement Officers will issue parking tickets to those that break parking laws.

S/HOU/20/1327: Removal of first floor hanging tiles and replacement with "Hardie Plank" weatherboarding. At: Gambles End, Back Lane Blunsdon Swindon SN26 7BJ – **PC agreed to support the Conservation Officers decision.**

Licence Application

Notification of a variation of HGV operation licence from AU Grab Hire, Fairview Kingsdown Lane. **PC agreed to ask SBCllr Penny to contest the Licence as the site and Lane are possibly not suitable and there is already an alleged breach of planning on the site. The Licence was contested by SBC and the Planning Enforcement Team is investigating the alleged breach.**

S/OUT/19/1736 – Outline application for 60no. close care units for older persons (use class C2) and associated facilities. Access not reserved at: Land South of Broadbush Blunsdon,

Application Withdrawn

S/HOU/20/1020 – 35 Holdcroft Close Blunsdon. Planning Officer minded to approve revised plans that retain a separation gap of 100mm from the boundary. **Blunsdon PC agreed to withdraw our objection.**

Parish Council Finances

The Parish Council members are all volunteers and give up their time freely and make a substantial contribution to the community. There is a national system in place where any PCllr can be awarded a small annual allowance from the Precept. When we discussed this, the general feeling was that we would continue to agree that the PC would not claim any allowances. However, an amendment was suggested that an allowance could be claimed if a PCllr wanted, so the Parish Council has agreed for the first time ever to allow Parish Councillors to claim an allowance. The time has come for us to plan the budget for next year. In the current climate with the loss of income from the Parish facilities we have decided to pare the budget down to necessities. Our aim for 2021/22 is to keep the Precept at or below this year's level. As with every budget we do have some routine costs and some unavoidable planned costs, e.g. the Village Hall boiler has become unreliable and parts are now obsolete so it will need replacing.

Grounds Maintenance

The PC has recently completed a review of the Grounds Maintenance work carried out by our contractor. We concluded that overall, the maintenance was good. A 'walk' of the areas was carried out and a few priority areas were identified that extra work was needed; e.g. the hedge along the pathway from Linley Road to the Recreation Ground opposite the School needs reducing in height and thinning, and there are some dead and dangerous trees that need removing also the area on the corner of Sams Lane and High Street is heavily overgrown and needs work.

Speedwatch

The volunteers of Speedwatch will resume their speed safety checks throughout the village roads during November and will be noting those that break the limits.

As the traffic rebuilds after the effect that the lockdown has had, we have begun to collect data on traffic and speed to examine how both can be mitigated. This with the data from Speedwatch will give us evidence to prove the need for calming measures to make the Parish safer.

Parish Roads

We have complained to both developers about the condition of the road surface in High Street and Broadbush after the works that have taken place there. They have acknowledged the complaints and have assured us that when work on the roads is completed, they will be resurfaced.

Multi Use Games Area (MUGA)

Money has been set aside over the years by developers around the Parish for the Parish Council to be able to develop the old Tennis Courts and grassed area behind them into a MUGA and cricket nets. We have been working with Swindon Borough Council for a long time, to try and move this forward however they have admitted that they do not have the capacity to do it. Therefore, we have engaged a consultant to put a plan together to achieve planning permission. These areas will primarily be used by the school during the day and available to the local sports teams and public during the evenings. As the project moves forward, we will share the progress with you via these pages and with open exhibitions where you can share your ideas with us.

From the Vicar's desk.....

Gathering to worship in a time of pandemic.

Earlier this month I got to go to the Cathedral in Bristol and to be blessed by a service of ordination. A rite of passage for every church of England Priest. A day of great celebration, solemn oaths and the whole community of friends, family, church members and cathedral staff along with the Bishops gather to affirm our ministry and to celebrate God's grace. Well this year there were only 30 people in the whole cathedral. We were masked and distant from each other, unable to shake hands and hug. I was concerned that it would be a sad day where we would be mindful of all that was missing but instead in the space and the extra quiet I became even more aware that even though the people were missing God was present.

This scene is being played out in Churches up and down the country. We have to wear masks, sharing the peace is now difficult, we cannot embrace each other as we would like. But God is still there.

Many of us this year have turned to the God we knew as children and have asked for help and reassurance, God is still there waiting with open arms ready to call us home, but as adults we find that God isn't some divine cash machine that gives us everything we want we find that God includes us in the work. This isn't a one-way street, God is looking for relationship, Jesus calls us to be his brothers and sisters, his hands and feet, he invites us to join him on the journey and to change the world with him, one prayer and one loving act at a time. This year of pandemic has made us all more keenly aware that God is not contained in a building and not shackled by our rules of what worship must look like. God is seen in our acts of kindness, our humble acceptance of help, God is moving in the hospitals, God provides rest for the weary, and is the hope of the broken hearted, God is present in the bread broken and carefully shared.

By coming together at Church we are not looking to find God, after all he has always been with us, instead we are joining in with the unending praises of heaven, being comforted by each other and encouraged by our collective faith. By joining with others of faith we are working out together how to partner with God in the work of love and blessing in our homes, and in the wider world.

St Leonards Blunsdon is open Tuesday and Thursday for private prayer and is holding two services a month from the building on the first and third Sundays. If at this time the idea of gathering with others causes you to feel anxious, please stay at home and know that God is with you there. TALES of VENICE, the Guide Dog puppy

Hi, hope you are all keeping safe and well.

Did you guess how long ago the first known example of a special relationship between a dog and a blind person occurred? The earliest recorded example 79AD. Excavations in Pompeii show a wall-painting of a blind man being led by his dog.

A Chinese scroll dated 1200 AD, now in the Metropolitan Museum New York shows a blind man being led by a dog.

References appear more frequently throughout the 16th Century throughout the world.

1727 Gainsborough painted "*Blind Man on the Bridge*" which depicts a dog leading its master.

1914-18 World War 1 re-sparked interest in guide dogs due to so many young men being blinded following exposure to mustard gas or as the result of shell shock. The German Red Cross Ambulance Dogs Association established a training centre. The first guide dog was issued in 1916 to a blinded veteran, Paul Feyen. Within a year there were 100 guide dogs issued and 539 issued by 1919.

1934 Guide Dogs for the Blind Association (GDBA) was established in the UK.

1940 Leamington Spa opened as the first UK guide dog Training Centre.

A Recipe from CookFoodFan



I have a habit of collecting recipes torn out of magazines, when I cook one I tick it if we like it or it ends up in the bin. My project is to make a family favourite recipe book (one day!). This recipe is one such family favourite and cooked often. Lancashire Beef Crumble is an odd recipe being a savoury not sweet crumble, but delicious and easy to make.

Lancashire Beef Crumble (serves 4)

Ingredients

1 onion, finely chopped
455g minced beef
115g button mushrooms, roughly chopped
115ml beef stock, made using 1 red Oxo and water
1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
Salt and black pepper

For the crumble:

30g butter
115g plain flour
55g Lancashire cheese, grated (I use mature Cheddar)

Method

1. Preheat the oven to gas 6, 200°C.
2. Fry the onion, beef and mushrooms for 5 minutes in a large, non-stick frying pan.
3. Add the beef stock and Worcestershire sauce and season. Cover the pan and simmer for 30 minutes.
4. Meanwhile, rub the butter into the flour with your fingertips. Stir through the grated cheese.
5. Put the beef mix into a shallow, ovenproof dish and cover with the crumble mix.
6. Bake for 25 minutes until golden.
7. Enjoy.
